- Symbaloo <http://www.symbaloo.com> – social bookmarking tool that gives you visual symbols of your tiles.
 - This would be a great way to get kids to websites because they can see where they are going using the icons.
 - You can get an embed code and share (publicly) on your website so kids can use it to access sites. You can also post a url from the share portion that will take kids (and parents) to a non-editable version of the Symbaloo webmix.
- MultitURI <http://www.multituri.com> - collect websites into a group and then create one url for that group of websites. Could be useful for professional collaboration/sharing purposes.
- Sound Cloud <http://www.soundcloud.com> - upload and share any sound
- QR codes – (quick response) reader or scanner. Lots of information can be stored in this one symbol. Allows non-readers to access information (audio, video, text, etc).

Tools you can use to make a QR Code:

The steps you take to use a YouTube video in a QR code are:

1. Make sure the video is on the Education side of YouTube
 - a. Copy the URL(s) from YouTube
 - b. Create a helpdesk ticket and select YouTube Education as the category
 - c. Paste the URL(s) into your helpdesk ticket
2. Once you receive confirmation that your video is available on the Education side, copy that URL
3. Convert the URL to a mobile URL:
 - . **Original Video URL from youtube/education**

4. Visit qrstuff.com
5. Select YouTube video as your QR Source
6. Paste the adapter video URL and use the QR code
